

Scout Weekend Packing List

This list is provided as a simple guideline to plan what you will need for a typical Troop 81 weekend camping trip.

**Medications should be clearly marked with the Scout's name, medication name, and dosage.
Give to the Assistant Scoutmaster in charge of holding medications.**

Please leave these things at home:

Electronic Devices – Radios, music devices, Game Systems, etc....	Personal tents (we provide these for the scouts)
Axes, Saws, Sheath Knives, Fireworks, Weapons of any kind.	Candy, gum or snacks (to avoid potential for life/safety risks)
	Cans or bottles of Soda/Gatorade/Ice Tea/etc.

Official BSA Uniform –

Is to be worn on the day we leave and the day we come back - *always* dress for the weather
Uniform Shirt (khaki) - Shorts/Pants (green) – Belt - Scout Socks - Troop Outback Hat

These items go in your backpack/duffle bag (no wheels) and goes in the trailer

Clothing:

Socks (2 pairs)
Troop Tee Shirts (2)
Underwear (2)
Pair of Long Pants (2)
Pair of Shorts (1, optional)
Troop Sweatshirt
Jacket/Coat (seasonal)
Sleepwear
Hiking shoes/boots- (broken in)
Extra Pair of Shoes or sneakers
only if specified by leader
(No Open-Toe Sandals or Shoes)
Rain gear/Poncho!!!!!!
Troop knitted cat

Toiletries:

Soap in a carrier (or plastic bag)
Towels and washcloths (1)
Toothbrush & Toothpaste
Comb or Brush
Deodorant (*unscented is safest for camping*)
Tissues

Bedding:

Sleeping Pad (optional-but suggested)
Sleeping bag (use proper rating for temperatures)
Pillow or camp pillow

Other Items

Scouts Folding Chair (1) (optional)
Musical Instrument (if you play)
10x10 tarp

Put these items in your daypack

Camping Gear:

Flashlight (w/extra batteries & bulb)
Headlamp (w/extra batteries)
Canteen or reusable Water Bottle (filled)
Mess Kit (Initial all utensils)
Cup/mug

Other Items:

Medications – see top of page
Scouting Handbook!!!!
Wristwatch!!!!!!!!!!!!
Notebook and pencils
Compass
Pocket knife (only 1) - 2nd Year
Card Games (optional)
Camera, batteries and SD cards
(cell phones will be taken from scouts if used for anything other than a camera)
Power Block and cord – adults will not be charging devices in their cars.
